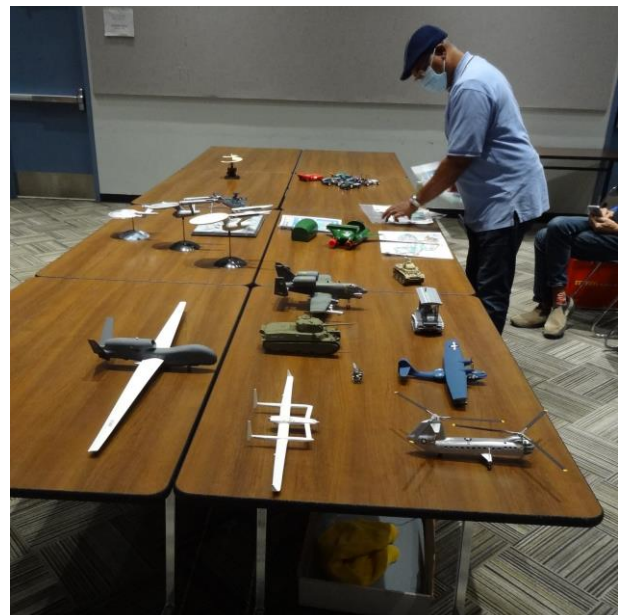
SECOND TIME'S A CHARM, SEEMS AT MPD MEET

AND A REMINDER WE HAVE TWO SVSM MEETINGS SCHEDULED FOR THIS MONTH TOO

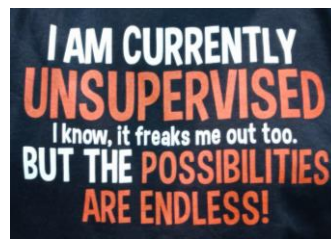

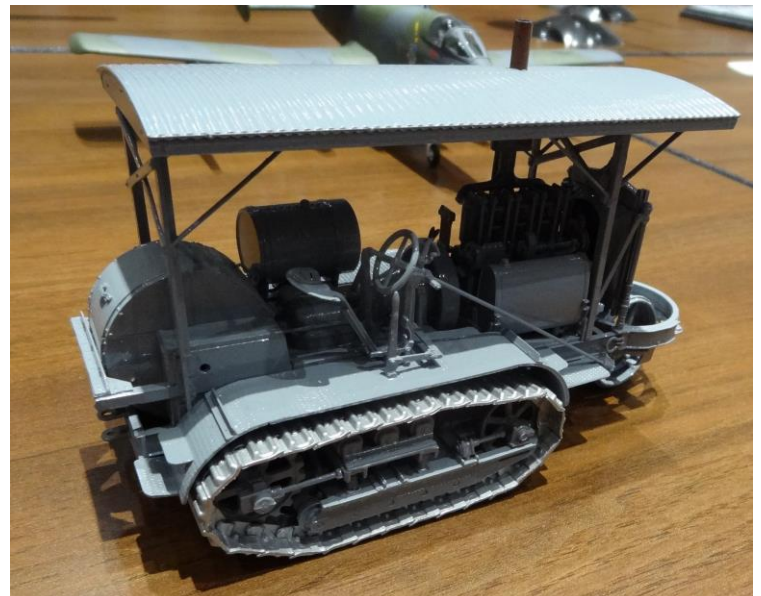
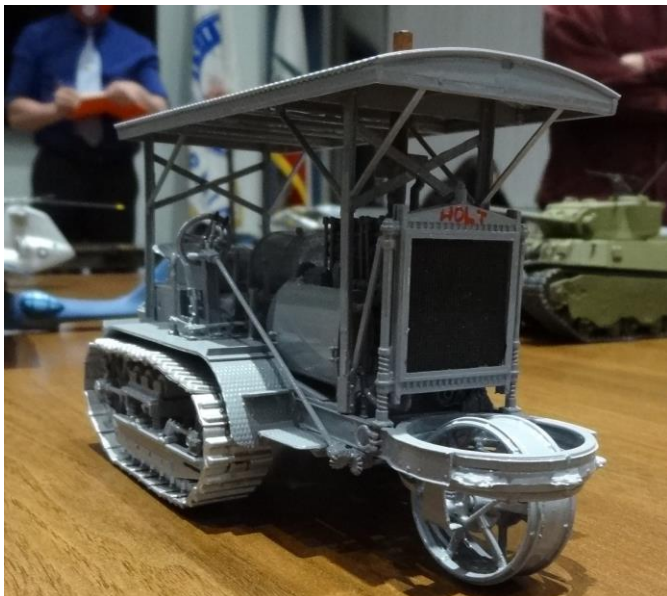

Turned out in fact we had some one who recently returned to the area who was a club member back in the 1970s! His most recent club experience was a welcomed time spent with the friendly community of the IPMS Santa Rosa. Mr. Patrick Galleguillos also shared with us his recent modelling, as you will see soon enough.



Right now, we'll start the Model Talk portion in review of **Cliff Kranz's collection** seen on right, beginning with his local connection construction.

This is a 1928 Holt Tractor. Holt began in Stockton, CA and became the Caterpillar Tractor Corp.



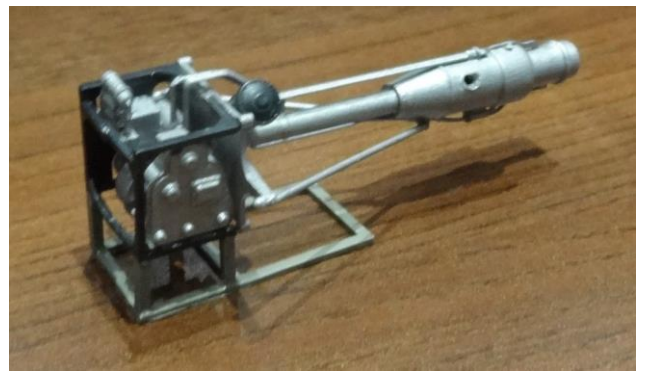
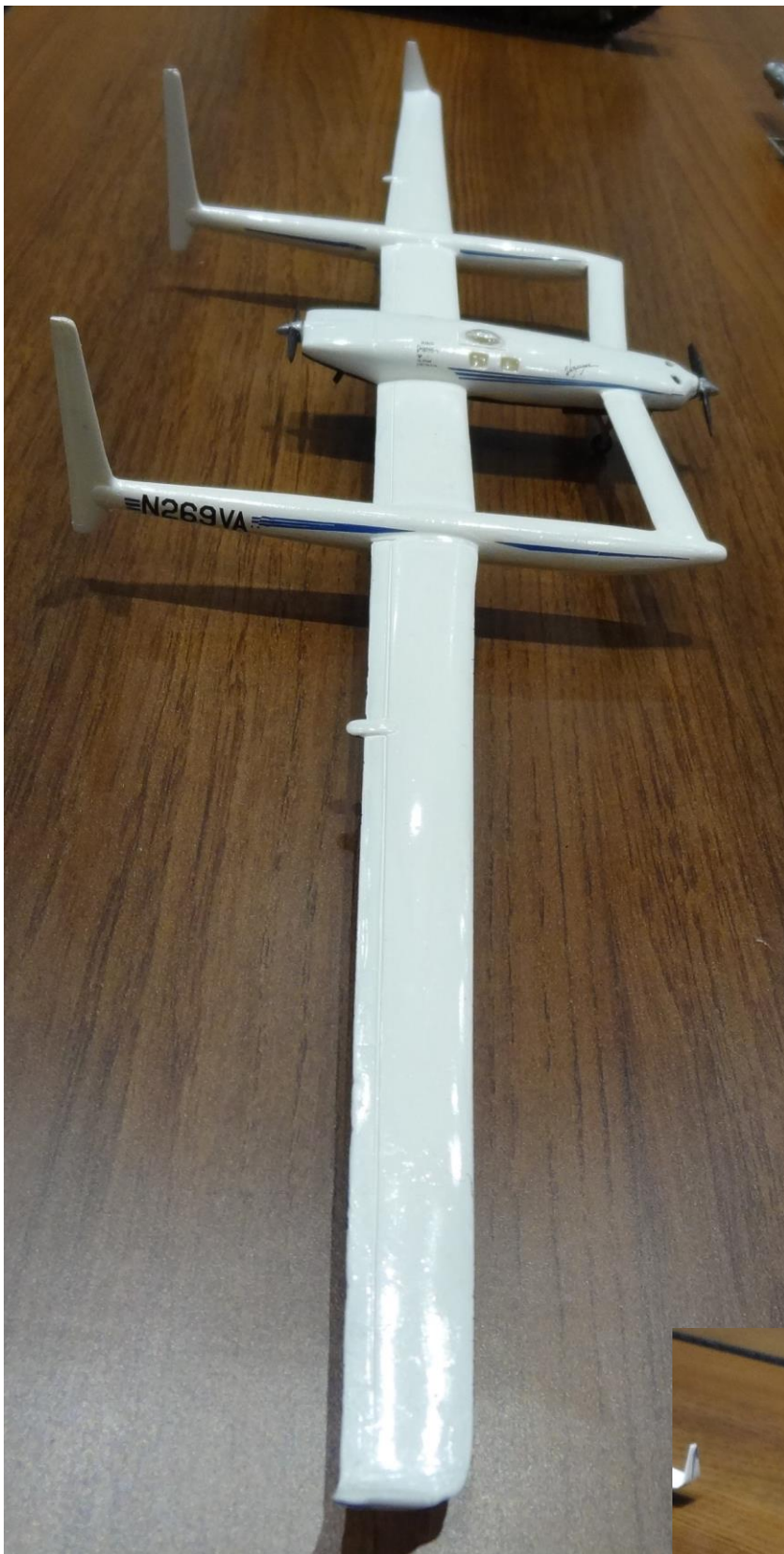


With great enthusiasm for the idea, Cliff took up the Atlantis Models Challenge Category for SV Classic # 7 coming now in 2022, as added reason to check the 1/104 scale PBX-5A re release. He recalled building an original release of this Monogram molding back in 1955, the kit's birth year



Cliff reported that he erred in his description of his Global Hawk RPV when he brought it to SVSM Meet in September @ Game Kastle. It's 1/48, not 1/72. BIG model either way. His YH-16 below is a conversion back to piston original from turbine powered YH-16A kitted in 1/96th by Revell (Atlantis)





Above, Cliff's rendition in 1/32 scale of a Messerschmitt 163 Komet propulsion unit. This from the Hasegawa kit of Me-163.

To the left, Burt Rutan's Voyager record setting aircraft, in 1/72 scale from Amodel.

As you may already know, Cliff is prolific and holds no boundaries to his modelling.

If he likes it, he builds it or makes it so.

Example below, his "A-17" (# 2 in a series, as in he did it once in 1/72, so why not in 1/48?) Pandemic modelling!



We will wrap up Cliff's October revolution with a quick look at his 1/35 scale Dragon Black Label series kit of the cast hull M6.

This USA armored vehicle was a 6 man crew with a complement of 76mm, 37mm guns and no less than 5 machine guns. Very 1941 ...



Keeping with the theme of Air and Armor, **Laramie Wright** here had also an Atlantis kit re-issue underway. That is his B-24 in cream color plastic, an originally Revell USA mold.

The next three AFVs in line, I had no recollection so unable to give any more details here.

But that is a British Crocodile on the other end, I can say !



Mariah Coester likes the Academy series of Leonardo Da Vinci designs so much, she tackled handily the “helicopter” Even solving (again!) mechanical dysfunction of the drive motor. She has encountered this twice before with Flying Machine and one of the Da Vinci Clock kits, you see.



John Carr made the best he could of the enforced lockdown time, his Lindberg 1/48 scale kit of F11C Goshawk he said, proved to be challenging but enjoyable as part of that. Golden Age BiPlane, indeed !
